The GSQ Show Boutique Committee thanks you in advance for your contributions to our show.

What to make?: Quilting, crocheting, knitting, doll making or other crafts – whatever displays your best talent. NOTE: If you're are using a commercial copyrighted pattern, please contact the company to get permission to sell a few of the finished items at the show.

Pricing: You may suggest a price, however, the Boutique committee has the last say on pricing.

Ideas: Lap quilts, baby quilts, bibs, dolls, pillowcases, small purses and tote bags, holiday items, seasonal items, sports themed items, kitchen items, tableware, napkins, placemats, sewing kits, pin cushions, sachets, travel jewelry holder, coffee cup sleeves, coasters, potholders, fabric bowls and baskets, wine bottle bags, orphan blocks, cloth baskets, small stuffed animals, coin purses, small zipper bags, etc.

**Turn in items:** Items may be turned in at our guild meetings or contact Jann or Donna. The deadline for donations will be our September 2023 meeting.

**Return of items:** Anything that does not sell will be returned at the November 2023 guild meeting after the show.

## Quilt Show (Oct 2023)

Little Wishes Raffle: Little Wishes are small quilts that are raffled off at the Guild Quilt Show. The quilts should be no smaller than 12" on a side and no larger than 24" on a side. Any quilting or design technique is acceptable. A hanging sleeve is not required. The quilts should be newly made and clean. The Little Wishes are raffled off at the quilt show in bunches of about 20-24, there will be three or four of these drawings each day of the show. Raffle tickets are \$1 each. Little Wishes Quilts can be turned in to Ginger Scott at any of the regular general Guild meetings.
